Dear parents and care givers

Surveys

A big thank you to all those parents and carers who have taken the time to fill in the school surveys. School surveys are a way of testing how the community is feeling and your way of being heard. It is very important that your views are known, if we do not know how you feel about what we are doing then we cannot improve. The senior children will also have their chance to give their views this week. Please be aware that these are the mandated Department of Education surveys that all schools are required to do every two years. The surveys that we asked you to complete at the beginning of this year, and will ask you to complete at the beginning of next year are to do with the improvement journey we are on with the Fogarty Foundation. Dates have been extended for the completion of the survey. Follow the links sent via sms or posted on P&C facebook page or collect a copy from the school office.

Head lice

There seems to be quite an outbreak of head lice at the moment. I would be very grateful if you would check your child's hair regularly for the next couple of weeks. If you find evidence of eggs or live lice there are several ways they can be treated. The Pharmacy stocks many different brands of treatment you can also treat them without chemicals. Pure eucalyptus oil mixed with a cheap runny conditioner (1 cup conditioner to ¼ cup oil) applied to dry hair and left for 10 minutes makes the combing of eggs out much easier. Lice have a 10 day cycle so the eggs need to be combed out daily for 10 days if the lice are not to come back. If your child does not have lice then there are a couple of things you can do to prevent them getting them. Tea tree oil sprayed on the hair as a powerful deterrent. If your child has long hair please consider putting it up into a ballet bun. Contrary to popular belief, head lice cannot jump; they spread through head to head contact. If your child has long hair then it makes a really easy pathway to the head. Having the hair tied up in a bun minimises this.

Hats

Hats must be worn outside during every term at Northam Primary School, winter or summer. As the sun is getting stronger it is even more important to adhere to this. Please make sure your child has a hat to wear. Without a hat, your child will be required to stay under hard cover and will not be allowed to play on the ovals or in the nature play area during recess and lunch breaks. If you do not have a hat, school hats are available for purchase from the office.

Named clothing

When the weather warms up our pile of lost property grows. We have jackets and jumpers galore. Please take the time to write your child's name on each piece of clothing that they are likely to remove when at school (hats, jumpers, jackets). If there is a name on the clothing we always take the time to find out what class the owner is in and return the item. Unfortunately the vast majority of clothing in our lost property pile is unnamed.
